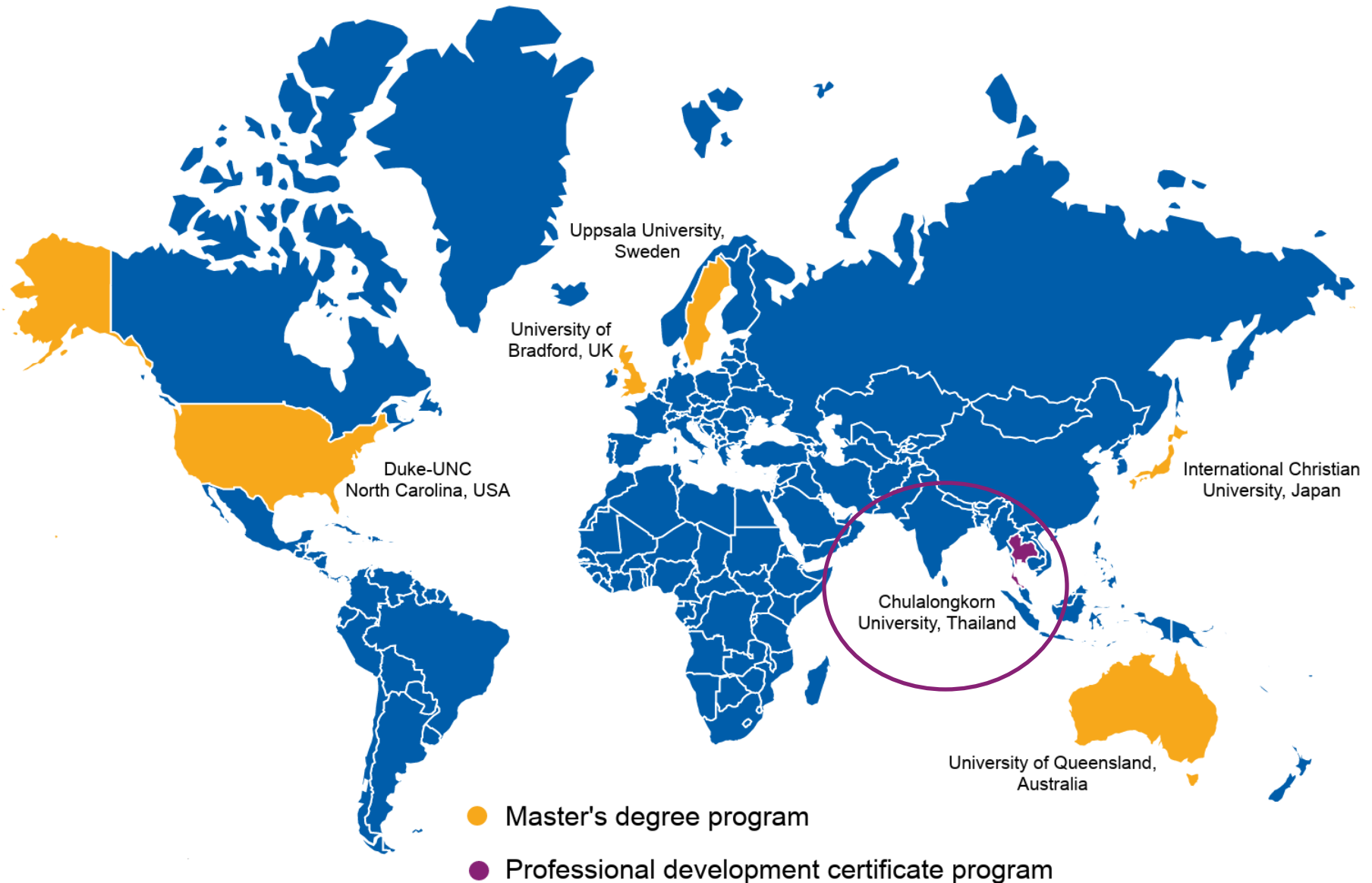

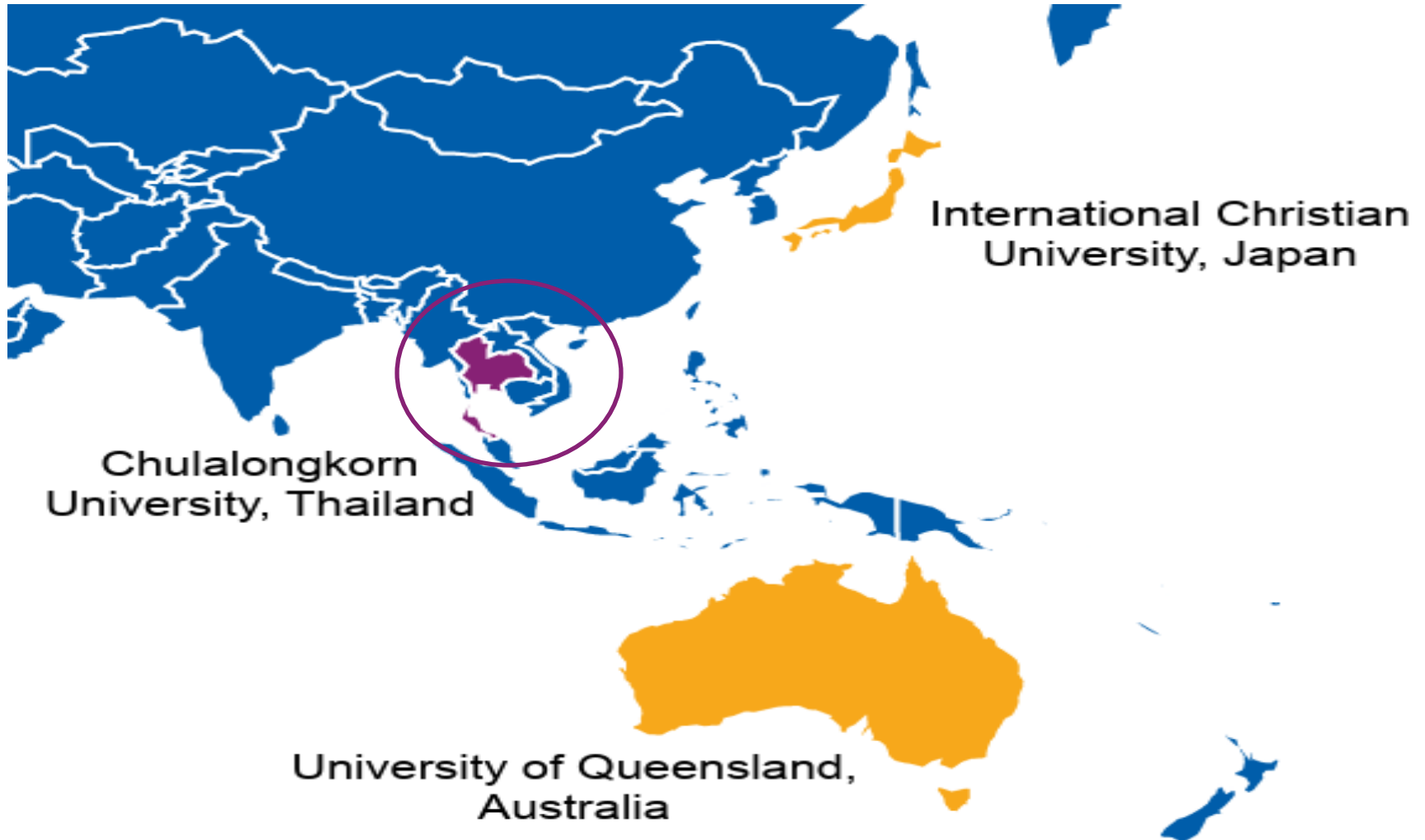

Rotary Peace Fellowship Options

Each year: Up to 100 peace fellows selected

Professional Development Program (3-month course):

- Experienced professionals
- Up to 50 fellows per year (25 per session)
- 3 month course, 2 sessions per year

Master's Program:

- Young professionals
- Up to 50 fellows per year (10 per Center)
- 15-24 month course



Eligibility and Selection Criteria

Applicants' Qualifications:

- Proficiency in English
- Excellent leadership skills
- Demonstrate a commitment to peace and conflict resolution
- **Certificate program**
 - strong academic background
 - 5+ years full-time related work experience
- **Master's program**
 - bachelor's degree
 - 3 years full-time related work experience
 - proficiency in a second language preferred

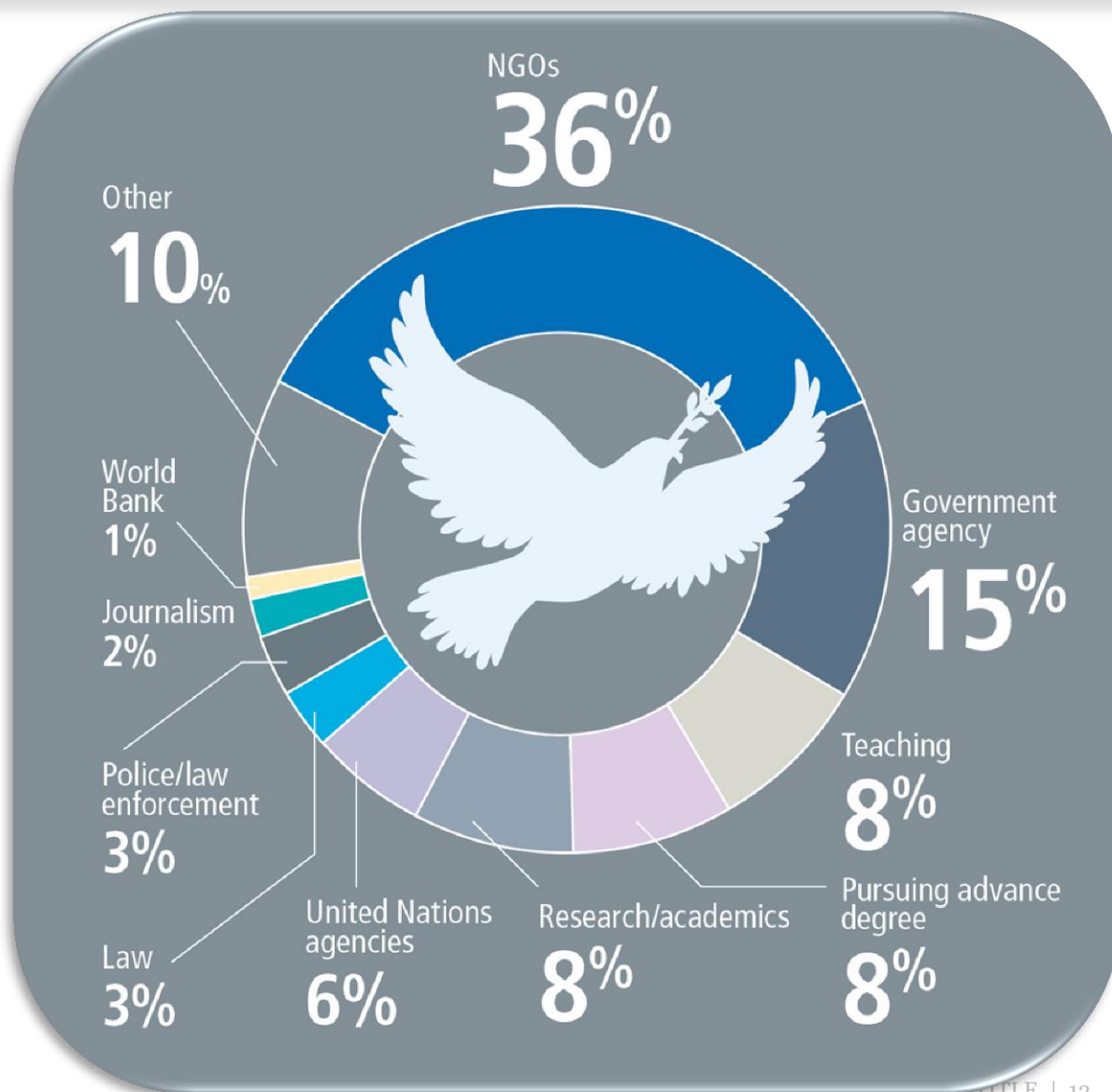

Application Timeline for Districts

Dec-May 31

RECRUIT

- Clubs and Districts recruit applicants
- **December - May**



INTERVIEW AND ENDORSE APPLICANTS

- **REQUIRED** for Districts
- **OPTIONAL** for Clubs
- Once an application is received, interview and select which candidates you would like to endorse
- **May 31 applications are due to district**



Jul 01

APPLICATION DEADLINE

- All endorsed applications are due to TRF by **1 July**



TRF Processing

- Districts will receive confirmation that the application has been received



Selection Committee

- Finalists and Alternates will be selected in **November**



Announcements

- Applicants, Clubs and Districts will be notified about results in **November**

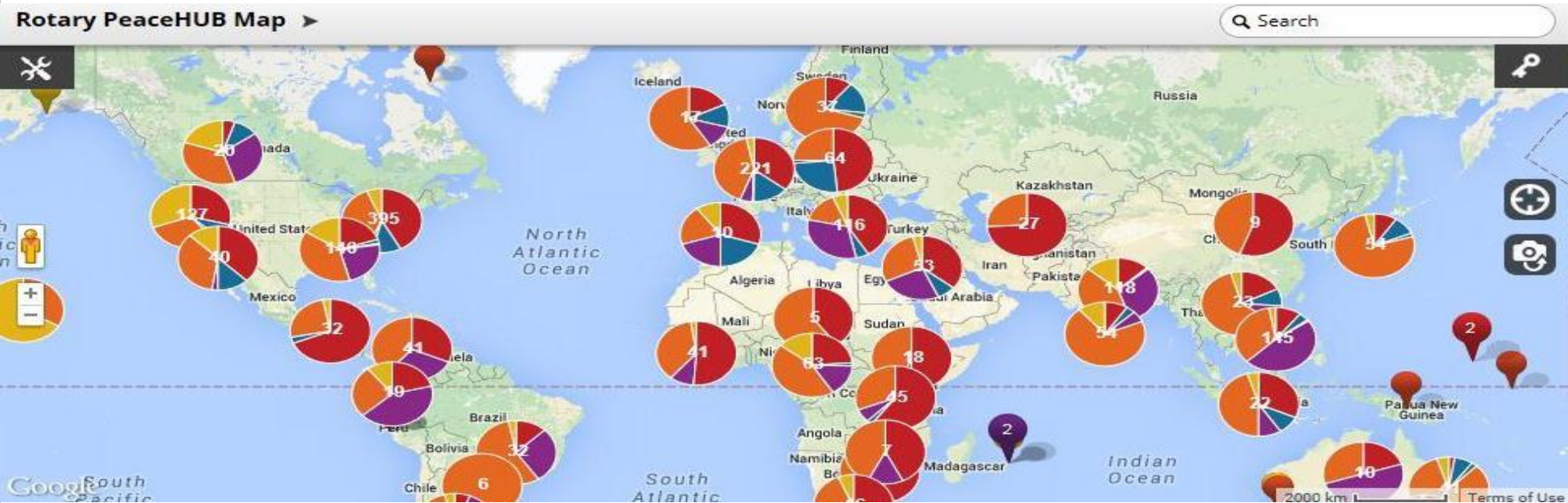

Master's fellows benefit from:

- Diverse curricular offerings with core coursework in peace and conflict resolution
- Connection with cohort of peace fellows and a global network of Rotarians
- 3-month applied field experience
- Guest speakers, international experts
- Annual conference

How to apply

1. Review entire application at www.rotary.org/peace-fellowships. Application live in February.
2. Research curriculum and programs at each Rotary Peace Center
3. Connect with a local Rotary club or district to request an interview and endorsement. Rotary district interviews and endorsement are required.
4. Complete the online application for submission to the district by 31 May
5. Applicants are notified in November of the Rotary Foundation's decision
6. Once selected, fellowship finalists must apply separately for university admission.
