Case Study for Treasurer

The club has one bank account with \$10,000 that has been transferred to your name. Yours is the only name on the account. The last financial review for the club was over five years ago.

What would your concerns, if any, be? And what would you do to address those concerns?

What would you do to improve how the club's finances are handled?
